Commentary As in many of Limousin's portraits, the sitter is posed behind a parapet or table before a solid blue background. Dressed in black with a black cap, he is shown with a meticulously rendered beard. Limousin seldom includes hands in his portraits, perhaps because they can be distracting, as are those here, with the sitter's entwined fingers clasping an oddly folded piece of paper.
